LGPOA Survey

The LGPOA Board would like to thank all who participated in the recent survey. 111 islanders made their voices heard and hours were spent analyzing their responses. The method for analyzing results was simply to track and organize the number of times a particular issue was raised and in what context. From this tallying of information we narrowed islander's top concerns which are outlined below. Each issue was mentioned a minimum of 10 times. We found that many of the concerns sited were identical to the expressed concerns found in a 2005 LGPOA survey with the addition of a few and some creative suggestions to address others. Because of the duplication of concerns on issues, the LGPOA has chosen to postpone the aforementioned idea of a second survey. Thank you again to all who participated. We are committed to work and advance your concerns in our upcoming agenda.

Survey results:

1) Gas powered ATV's (speed and noise)

2) Increase police protection during peak times (major holidays, spring break)

3) Maintenance of the North/South road (Road and Landscape)

4) Government over reach (Keep it simple)

- 5) Dogs on beach (leashed/unleashed/waste) all sides represented
- 6) More regular island clean ups (appliances, etc.)
- 7) The impact on island by rental properties
- 8) Managing growth

Environmental Committee From Environmental Chair, Linda Soderquist:

Red Tide

"This time of year we often hear about Red Tide in the news. The latest reports from FWC indicate that the red tide organism (Karenia brevis) is blooming out in the gulf off the coast of Charlotte County. Although the occurrence of a red tide cannot be predicted, scientists can forecast its movement using wind and water current data once a bloom is located. Scientists also monitor the concentration of the red tide organism by collecting water samples routinely and in response to blooms. Some people experience respiratory irritation (coughing, sneezing, tearing and an itchy throat) when the Florida red tide organism is present and winds blow onshore. Red Tide can also affect marine animals as well as dogs near the beach. The Florida Department of Health advises people with severe or chronic respiratory conditions, such as emphysema or asthma, to avoid red tide areas.
