Environmental

From Environmental Chair, Linda Soderquist:

"Crocodile or alligator? Recently, one of these reptiles was spotted on LGI's beach. Which one was it? American Crocodiles are normally limited to brackish habitats such as ponds, coves, or mangrove swamps, and their habitat is limited to southern Florida. Recently, individual crocs have been spotted further north, but sightings outside extreme south Florida are still rare. Alligators, on the other hand, are primarily freshwater animals and do not live in the ocean. Alligators are commonly found all over Florida in ponds, freshwater lakes, and brackish lagoons. They have been spotted in saltwater, but visit for only short intervals. Perhaps they are using the salt water to rid themselves of parasites, or drifted into the Gulf during a heavy rainfall. Our island's reptile was photographed, but no positive identification could be made. Check out Croc vs. Gator ID for more information. Observe and photograph these reptiles from a distance. Remember, they're an important part of Florida's natural history as well as an integral component of aquatic ecosystems.
