**Sailboat Update

At the March 23, 2016 hearing, a judge ordered the loose debris (the parts that are on the beach, near the dunes) to be removed prior to May 1st, the beginning of the turtle-nesting season. The rest of the vessel (buried in the wet sand) is to be removed within 340 days. The owners are to coordinate the removal efforts with FWC, DEP, Charlotte County and whoever else might have an interest in this to make sure the removal does not cause any further damage.

At present, the vessel remains half buried in the sand, but great news...the debris has been removed from the beach!

**Environmental Committee

From Environmental Chair, Linda Soderquist:

Sea turtle season is here! Nesting season runs from May 1st through October 31st.

Please note these highlights from the Charlotte County Sea Turtle Ordinance 98-14:

- Remove your furniture from the beach at sunset.
- No lights can shine on the nesting areas, so be sure your outside house lights facing the beach are off at night, and do not use flashlights on the beach.
- Vehicles and fires are not permitted on the beach.

**Little Gasparilla Island Fire and Rescue (LGIFR)

From Bob Weronik, President: Quarter 1 2016 Accomplishments:

- Stabilized paid staff by addressing morale, appointing acting fire chief, and hiring new FF/medics.
- Established 4 Advisory Group with community representation.
- Developed and communicated board strategies and priorities.
- Conducted an analysis of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (risk assessment) (positioned for grant applications).
- Developed a collaborative relationship with CCFR, which was non-existent.
- Working through fire house lease renewal completed 90% of building and grounds repairs agreed to during last lease negotiation – held community volunteer firehouse clean up

event with 16 volunteers.

- Hosted 2 "coffee and donuts" meet and greet event with Acting Fire Chief Adams to build island relationships.
- Gained approval from Acting Fire Chief for Firefighter 1 online training.
- Updated website, archived dated documents.
- Conducted an analysis of Engine 71 accessibility learned a good portion of island cannot be served by apparatus.
- Conducting a search for Fire Chief identified 2 final candidates – on hold due to possible litigation.
- Conducted a time / day analysis for fire and ems calls on island learned the vast majority of calls are EMS – concentrated in Hideway condos area – and times are diverse.
- Successfully passed State EMS compliance audit.
- Conducted an inventory and conditions assessment of LGIFR equipment for life cycle management.
