Placida Boat Ramp

From Deputy William Prummell:

The county has recently changed to a new pay by plate system for all county parking, to include the Placida Boat Ramp. As we know COVID had changed a lot of things and for a long time now it seems the kiosks at the ramp have been covered/shut down, not being utilized and paying for parking went by the wayside for many. The county has changed from pay by space at the kiosks to a pay by plate app-based program. This pay by plate app program began July 10th, 2021. This app is popular, easy to use and utilized by other counties and municipalities. Annual/Semi-Annual County parking passes are still valid. Vehicles with the proper annual/semi-annual pass affixed to their window do not need to use the app, this pass is checked for by deputies or parking enforcement first before checking the pay by plate data from the app.







I know some islander guests who commute themselves to the island in lieu of the water taxi may use this ramp, so I wanted this information to be shared. Some vehicles parked at the ramp have been determined to belong to full time islanders as well, and those islanders need to be aware of this new system and that the parking lot is not for long term use that you are not willing to pay for. I am attempting to reach out to those full-time residents via phone or in person as well, so they may avoid a citation. If there are any further questions you may reach out to me or Charlotte County Community Services at their number below and depicted on their sign at the ramp. I have also include frequently asked questions related to this topic.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Can a car park in a trailer spot

Yes

Q. Can more than one car park in a trailer spot

No, one space per vehicle

Q. Can a trailer occupy a space without a tow vehicle

Yes, however this can only be verified by paying through ParkMobile as a parking permit must be affixed to a vehicle window.

Q. Is a disabled parking permit holder required to pay to park?

No, parking is free for valid disabled permit holders, placards, license plate.

Q. How can I purchase a parking pass?

Any recreation center, pool, or the Tax Collector's Office. An application can also be downloaded from www.CharlotteCountyFL.gov and mailed to you.

Q. How much is a parking pass?

3-Month \$25.75 6-Month \$36.75 Annual Pass \$53.50

** Environmental Update

From Vice President, Rhonda Olson:

Turtle nests will begin hatching this month. It is imperative that lights are OUT on the beach as hatchlings can and will disorient with any artificial light. They head away from the ocean and toward any house with lighting, phone flashes/lights or flashlights.

What can you do to help this turtle hatching season?

- 1. Please turn off exterior lights (and pull shades/draw curtains) on your beach front homes.
- 2. Use only red filters for flashlights or phones there's an app for that.
- 3. Cover any holes that you may dig or that you see on the beach.
- 4. Remove all beach furniture and take away any trash.
- 5. Keep your dog leashed on the beach and remove your dog's excrement as well. We see a lot of dog excrement bags sitting on the beach full ---not sure why.
- 6. Do your best to help with rental houses on the island as the renters come and go quickly and re-education with each rental is important.

Mosquito population on the rise!

A mosquito's attraction to humans is very complex. Basically, mosquitoes are attracted to the carbon dioxide coming from the breath and pores of humans. In addition, some mosquito species are attracted to certain fragrances and colors. If you wish to be less attractive to mosquitoes, try using products that are unscented (i.e. hair spray, deodorant, soap, etc.) and light colored clothing. You can also try wearing commercially available, proven mosquito repellents. The most common proven repellent is N, N-diethyl-meta-toluamide or DEET. Be sure to read the entire label before using.

Charlotte County has over 37 species of mosquitoes! The county does do aerial spraying as well as ground spraying from an ATV. We have learned that the ground spraying is much more effective. When mosquito populations get out of control, call Charlotte County Mosquito Control and leave a message requesting ground spraying 941-764-4370.
