What is This? Night Blooming Cereus Cactus -

Cereus is a ceroid cactus with large night-blooming flowers. It can take several years for the plant to produce a single bloom. The white petals are 6-8 inches across, and it has white and yellow internal parts. The flower is pollinated by moths. They can be propagated by placing part of the cactus in sandy soil. It grows well on a trellis, and in the "wild" will climb up palm trees. Cactus fertilizer will help it grow during transplanting. Don't give it too much water or direct sun.
