No See Ums aka biting midges, biting gnats, sand flies

No see ums are small flies that look like a grain of dirt. They undergo a complete life cycle of egg, larvae, pupa, and adult in about 2-6 weeks.

The females are the biters, needing blood protein to start laying eggs. The bite is done by a specialized mouth part that resembles four tiny blades. The bites are not harmful to humans but are irritating.


To reduce their presence, remove all standing water which is needed for breeding.

You can wear long sleeve shirts and pants, and/or apply permethrin sprays, sprays with DEET, essential oils such as mint, camphor, and eucalyptus. Some claim Skin So Soft works as well.

They are more prevalent in the hours of dawn and dusk when is air is still.
